LEAF PICK-UP and DROP - OFF

Grass, weeds, leaves and small sticks in CLEAR plastic bags and SMALL bundles of sticks may be dropped off near the Town of Linn Highway Shop in Zenda on or before May 30.

AUTUMN leaf pick-up will be Saturday, November 13 for homes with Monday garbage pick-up. Drop-off in Zenda will be on or before November 28.

BULKY PICK-UP

Starting June 1 and through August 30, homes with Monday garbage collection will have weekly "bulky" pick up. Homes with Wednesday pick-up will have bulky collection the second collection of the month. All homes have weekly garbage and recycling pick up throughout the year.

COMPUTER / ELECTRONIC RECYCLING

Household electronics, including TV's and computer monitors, may be brought to the Town complex in Zenda, Saturday, August 7, between 9:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. John's Disposal will collect and recycle these items at no cost. You will be asked to give your name and Town of Linn address.

LAUNCH PASSES

Annual Boat Launch passes may be purchased by mail from the Clerk's office. Proof of current boat registration is required. A daily or seasonal launch fee is required for all motorized and/or trailered watercraft at both Town boat launches - Hillside Road and Linn Road. Daily launch fees are paid at the time of launch at either location. Launch fees are required for non-motorized & trailered watercraft - such as canoes, kayaks, and SUPs. Launch fees are applicable to both Linn residents and non-residents.

BEACH PASSES

Beach passes for the Village of Williams Bay beach are available at no charge to Town of Linn residents. There is a limit of four passes per household. To obtain a pass please bring proof of Linn residence, such as a property tax bill in your name, to the Village of Williams Bay office at 250 Williams Street. LINN SANITARY DISTRICT

The Linn Sanitary District continues to work with Associated Septic Service, last year's private on-site wastewater treatment systems (POWTS) inspector, to complete 30+ remaining inspections. The remaining inspections are due to challenges with identifying property owners. The District plans to complete the inspections by the end of summer 2021.

The District encourages all private well owners to test their wells for nitrate and bacteria by the end of the spring. For more information call 262-245-4532.

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LINN HIGHWAY

This is the second year in a row that the Town will resurface over 3 miles of road! The following roads/ subdivisions are scheduled to be resurfaced by June 1st: Maple Ridge from South Lakeshore Dr. to Southland Rd.; Southland Rd.; Wildwood Dr.; Maple Ct.; Sunnyside & Center; Lincoln Ave,; Meadow Ct. and Langolier Pl.; Elgin Club

In addition to resurfacing, the Town will provide maintenance work (crack filling, flex and infrared patching, chip seal work and a pavement rejuvenation chemical) to the following roads/subdivisions: Shadow Lane; Maple Ridge from Hwy B to Linton Rd.; Linton Rd.; Valleyview and Oakwood Drive; The Highlands Subdivision; Knollwood and North Lakeshore Dr.

We regret any inconveniences this work may cause but ask for everyone's patience around the work crews.

Earlier this year, the Town passed a road bond policy. The policy is primarily applicable to new building construction on Town roads. Please check the Town website and/or call the Building Inspector or Highway Superintendent with any questions.

GOLF CART REGISTRATION

In order to operate a golf cart on Town roads you must first register with the Town of Linn Police Department. Please be sure to familiarize yourself with the requirements and registration process provided at the Town website.

Upon completion of registration, the Town will issue a decal which shall expire on December 31 of odd years. The application fee is \$80.00 per vehicle.

The application fee and registration form can be mailed or dropped off to the Town of Linn Police Department. The Town Hall has a drop box (open 24/7) in the fover. For questions please contact the Police Department at (262) 275-6194.

DOG LICENSES

Full-time Town residents must license their dogs. The yearly fee is \$32 for a male or female dog or \$13 for a neutered male or spayed female dog. After June 1 a \$5 late fee will be added to each license. Licenses are available by mail from the Clerk's office with proof of current rabies vaccination.

ATTEND TOWN MEETINGS VIRTUALLY!

The Town of Linn now offers virtual attendance to board and committee meetings. The program functions the same as Zoom. Go to the Town website to access login information.

STORM SIRENS

Storm warning sirens are located throughout the town and are tested the third Wednesday of the month at noon. The test will sound for about 3 minutes. In the event of severe weather, the siren will sound, signaling to take cover and tune to a local radio or television station for detailed information. The sirens are serviced yearly. If you do not hear a siren on a test day, please contact the Clerk's office.

LAKE PATH

While walking on the lake path please remember that you are being given the privilege of crossing through people's front yards. Bicycles and motorized vehicles are not allowed on the path and dogs must be on a leash. Please respect that you are on private property and stay on the path and off the private piers. Prepare to clean up after your dog and yourself and take your garbage and your dog's waste with you. The Lake Path is NOT accessible through PRIVATE property, roads, or subdivisions. The path can be accessed at PUBLIC launch sites and at Big Foot Beach. Very limited parking is available at the Linn Road and Hillside Road launch ramps as well as at other public launch sites around the lake.

WATER SAFETY PATROL

For the past 100 years the Geneva Lake Water Safety Patrol (watersafetypatrol.org) has served the boaters and swimmers of Geneva Lake. In addition to aiding stranded boaters it conducts classes in swimming, boating safety, and lifeguard training during the summer. Boating Safety registration began May 1. Lifeguard training and swim lessons are held at different locations and times around the lake. In-person registration for swim lessons will begin in June at Aurora University George Williams College campus in Williams Bay.
